Stunning Wildflowers at Friends Walk

We had a lovely warm and sunny evening for our wildflower walk, led by our chairman Paul and his brother Michael. In a walk lasting just over an hour we visited different areas of habitat on the Backies, including woodland and meadows and saw 40 different species of wildflowers!

From the common and well-known such as clover to rarer species such as Smith's pepperwort there was an amazing variety of different plants. In the wooded area we found wild strawberries and flowers such as wood avens; while out in the open meadow we saw the lovely mauve betony and masses of deep maroon great burnet. Several types of grass also flourish there, such as Yorkshire fog, timothy and rye grass.

All in all, it was a really interesting and enjoyable way to spend an hour on a summer's evening and further proof (as if we needed it!) that the Backies is a special place for nature.

In 2007 & 2008 Paul and Michael carried out a botanical survey to establish the diversity of plant life on Clifton Backies.

After a thorough examination of plants on site, painstaking identification and cross checking against previous surveys, they counted 202 species over the two years. This included trees, shrubs, grasses, sedges, rushes, ferns and horsetails as well as wildflowers to ensure all flora was accounted for.

Results of this survey and others are used to feed into maintenance of the site and work that is carried out as part Clifton Backies Stewardship. We are confident that this will protect existing species and most likely add new species as habitats develop.
